FACTS

- 1 in every 10 people will have a seizure in their lifetime.
- In San Diego County 50,000 people are affected with epilepsy.
- More than half of these individuals continue to have seizures even with treatment.
- Epilepsy can occur at any age; affecting people of all ages, all races.
- More people have epilepsy than Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Sclerosis and Parkinson's disease combined!
- There are more than 20 seizure types ranging from brief losses of awareness to full convulsive seizures.

Our free services include individual and family counseling; career development; information and referral; individual advocacy; a parent network; adult and parent support groups; in-service educational seminars; a speakers bureau; classroom presentations; scholarships; and summer camp for children with epilepsy.

WHAT IS EPILEPSY?

Epilepsy (recurring seizures) is a common disorder of the central nervous system. Temporary electrical changes in the brain result in seizures, ranging from momentary staring spells to life-threatening convulsions. Some of the known causes of epilepsy are head injuries, strokes, tumors, birth defects, infections, genetic conditions and chemical changes in the brain, including those induced by drugs and alcohol.
